Dual-Use Export Controls In Europe

Structurally, chapters take a Q&A form to address must-know information for exporters e.g.,

- National licences and procedures/requirements for obtaining authorisations
- National legislation and key authorities responsible for legislating, enforcing and prosecuting export controls within each jurisdiction
- Application of catch-all and brokering controls
- Availability of online resources, e.g., e-licensing
- Enforcement and penalties

In addition, individual country chapters now include expanded descriptions of the nature of the dual-use goods sector in the jurisdiction, setting out the context for licencing and policy in each country.

WorldECR Editor Tom Blass said: 'Today's European Union is a different place from that of 2016. It faces different challenges. The war on the EU's borders, and the departure from the bloc of a country that had been an important member of its institutions, have a



significant impact on the application of export controls. As has the promulgation of Regulation 821/2021. This book will be a useful resource for all export control practitioners in Europe and beyond.'
